<p>Accountable to the Learning Community</p>	<p>Listen</p>  <p>Pay attention to the arguments of others.</p>	<p>Summarize</p>  <p>Restate the ideas of previous writers in new language.</p>	<p>Build</p>  <p>Add to the arguments or observations of previous writers</p>	<p>Mark</p>  <p>Direct attention to the importance of particular arguments or evidence.</p>
<p>Accountable to the Knowledge</p>	<p>Verify</p>  <p>Check your understanding of previous statements & knowledge.</p>	<p>Unpack</p>  <p>Explain how you arrived at your claims and findings.</p>	<p>Support</p>  <p>Give examples & evidence to support your claims and findings.</p>	<p>Link</p>  <p>Point out the relationships among previous arguments & knowledge.</p>
